Return to Oak Hill and enjoy a visit to this nationally recognized historic site. Jennifer Dickey (77A, 80C), curator, and Oak Hill students will offer tours of the family home. In addition, the museum store has special alumni merchandise for sale this weekend.

#### **Special Museum Exhibit: Erasing the Color Line**

In the fall of 1964, Berry College accepted three black students. At a time when schools across the South

were wracked by violence and dissent, Berry transitioned from its roots as a school for "poor, Anglo-Saxon children" to an integrated institution quietly and peacefully. This exhibit tells the story of integration at Berry and honors the courageous individuals who led the way in erasing the color line.

### **Grinding Corn at the Old Mill** Saturday, 10 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Constructed in 1930, the wooden overshot waterwheel is considered one of the largest in the world at 42 feet in diameter. For many years, the mill was operated by Mr. Green Berry Goodson, a white-bearded miller who ground Berry-grown corn into meal and grits. Water is piped directly from Berry's reservoir lake to the wheel. Once primed, the force of gravity is strong enough to push the water up the stone column and over the wheel, causing it to turn. Come out and see the Old Mill in operation and pick up a fresh bag of ground corn meal!

### **Possum Trot Open House** Saturday, 10 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Possum Trot Church, the "cradle of Berry College," was built around 1850 and appropriated by Martha Berry for the Possum Trot Sunday School in 1900. Miss Berry's title, "The Sunday Lady of Possum Trot," originated from her Sunday school at the church.

### **Roosevelt Cabin Open House** Saturday, 10 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Roosevelt Cabin, one of the oldest buildings on main campus, symbolizes more than any other building Miss Berry's history and philosophy. Soon after the school opened in 1902, Miss Berry drew up plans for a rustic log cabin, which was to serve as a guest house and a social center/demonstration cottage. The most famous visitor to the cabin was former President Theodore Roosevelt, who had lunch there during his visit on Oct. 8, 1910.

### **House o' Dreams Open House** Friday and Saturday, 2:30 p.m. – 3:45 p.m.

The House o' Dreams is a large stone and board-and-batten cottage on top of Lavender Mountain. It was built in 1926 by staff and students as a gift to Miss Berry. **Tour leaves from the Berry Alumni Center promptly at 2:30 p.m.** Limited capacity.
