RECOGNITIONS

The Intimate Justice Scale was selected by the U.S. Department of Children and Families as the instrument of choice to screen for domestic abuse in Marriage and Family Education courses through the Healthy Marriage Initiative.

The *AniCare Model of Treatment for Animal Abuse* has been codified as the recommended treatment for animal offenders in 42 U.S. states. Mental health professionals continue to be trained in this method in courses offered by Arizona State University.

The Intimate Justice Scale, published in 2004, has been translated into more than thirty languages, including Spanish, French, German, Finnish, Russian, Chinese, and Japanese and is used in Canada, Mexico, The Middle East, South America, Europe, Australia, and Japan.

My scholarly work on trauma in families has been featured in *Time Magazine*, *Self Magazine*, *USA Today*, and other popular magazines and newspapers.

In 2004 I was selected as Hartman Child and Family Scholar in recognition of my work on intimate justice, awarded by The Child and Family Press.

In 2004 I was invited by the Finnish Mental Health Association to conduct three days of training on intimate justice with that country's leading psychiatrists, psychologists, and social workers.

My 1997 research article, *Intimate Justice: Confronting Issues of Accountability, Respect, and Freedom in Treatment for Abuse and Violence*, was among the top five cited articles on domestic violence in the 1990's. The article has been reprinted in two separate volumes of *Readings in Domestic Violence* which are still in revised editions.
