Summer Residential Institutes

Each summer the Charter School of Education and Human Sciences partners with the Georgia Council on Economic Education to offer teachers a multi-day economics institute on the Berry College campus. The institutes immerse teachers in specially designed academic and experiential programs. The programs provide stimulating and relevant economics experiences that provide teachers with opportunities to develop greater understanding of economic issues. Past institutes have included International and Global Economies, the Math Behind Economics, and AP Economics. Content is presented by speakers representing state agencies and economics affiliations, economics teachers of the year, fieldtrips to targeted sites and technology integration.
