Associate of Arts in Music

Created, proposed, and implemented necessary courses for Dalton State to start an Associate's of Arts degree in Music. Students were enrolled as music majors as of Fall 2015. The process involved procuring space to teach these classes, creating large ensembles for students to participate in (band and choir), and finding adjunct faculty to teach the necessary lessons and classes.

Dalton/Whitfield Community Band

This ensemble was founded in November 2012 with the purpose of providing an artistic outlet for adult musicians in our area. In the fall of 2013 we expanded to allow Dalton State students to register and receive college credit for performing in the band. The band is now a cornerstone ensemble for our new Associate of Arts in Music degree. In addition, it has performed formal concerts each spring and fall since its founding, along with performances for Memorial Day and Veteran's Day in cooperation with other community organizations.

"Concerts on Campus":

Concert series created on the Dalton State College Campus, using funding provided by an Academic Enhancement Grant. During 2010-2011, we presented a total of seven concerts featuring artists from near and far. Audiences included students and local community members, and some in the audience traveled from as far away as Athens, Georgia to attend.

Campus Community Concerts:

These concerts are produced with DSC student performers recruited from music appreciation classes, along with willing faculty and staff performers.

Graduation Music:

Beginning in May 2015, the Dalton/Whitfield Community Band (of which I am the founder and a member) provides music for DSC graduation ceremonies.

From May 2011 through December 2014, I performed for DSC graduations as a member of the Moccasin Brass Quintet (now renamed Tennessee Valley Brass).
